Use **at** with times of day, including mealtimes, bedtime, etc.

at 3 o'clock, **at** 10.30am, **at** noon, **at** dinnertime, **at** bedtime,
at sunrise, **at** sunset, **at** the moment, etc.

Use **in** with months, seasons, years, decades, centuries and long periods of time in general

in May, **in** the summer, **in** 1990, **in** the 1990s, **in** the 20th century, **in** the Ice Age, **in** the past/future, etc.

Use **on** followed by days and dates

on Sunday, **on** Tuesday mornings, **on** 6 March, **on** 25 December 2010, **on** Christmas Day, **on** Independence Day, **on** my birthday, **on** New Year's Eve, etc.

Also, use **at** in the following common expressions

- **at** the weekend: *I don't usually work **at** the weekend.*
- **at** Christmas/Easter: *I stay with my family **at** Christmas.*
- **at** the same time: *We finished the test **at** the same time.*
- **at** present/**at** the moment: *He's not home **at** present. Try later.*
